Average ACT Scores for Public High Schools - Class of 2001

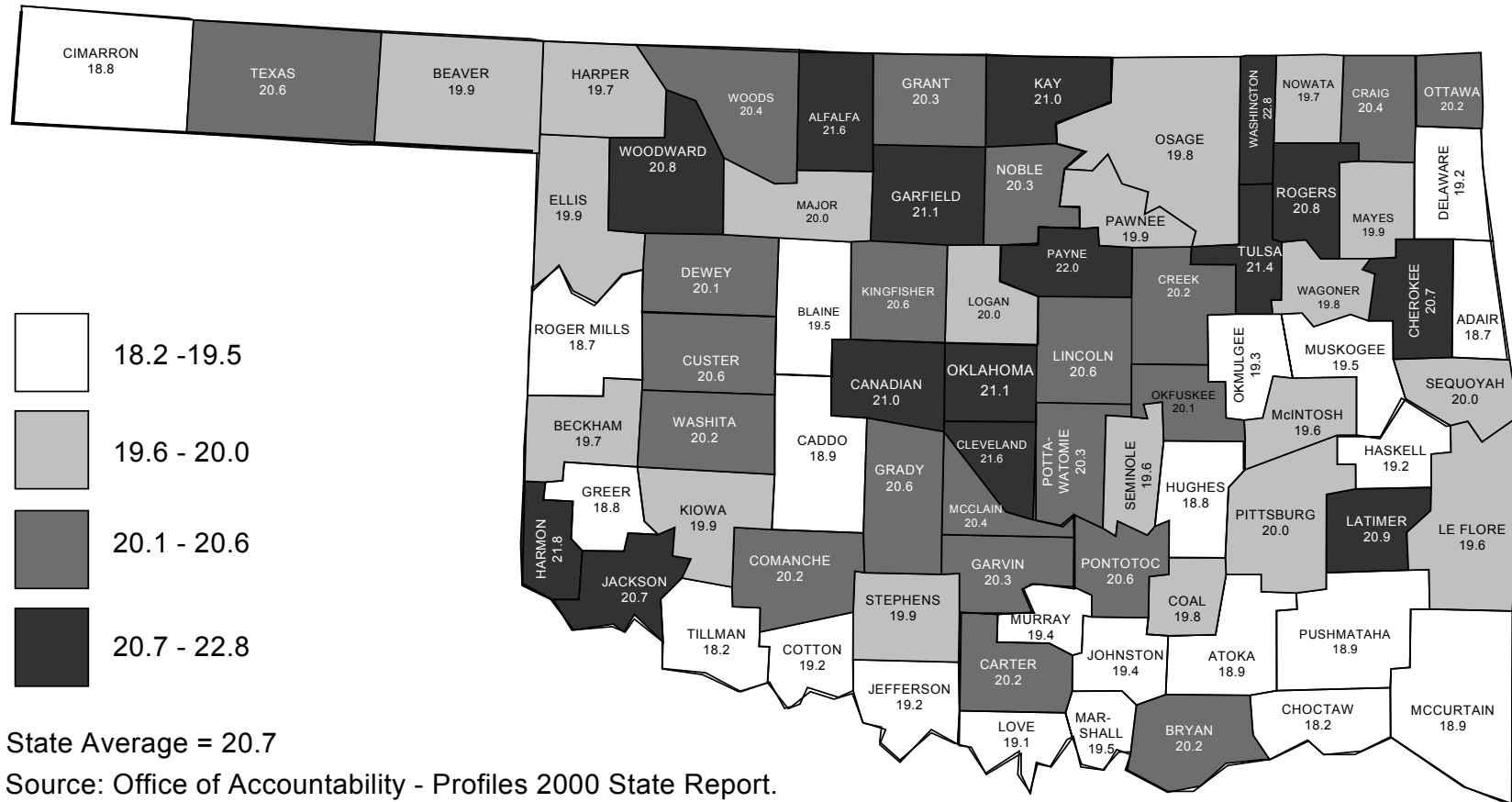

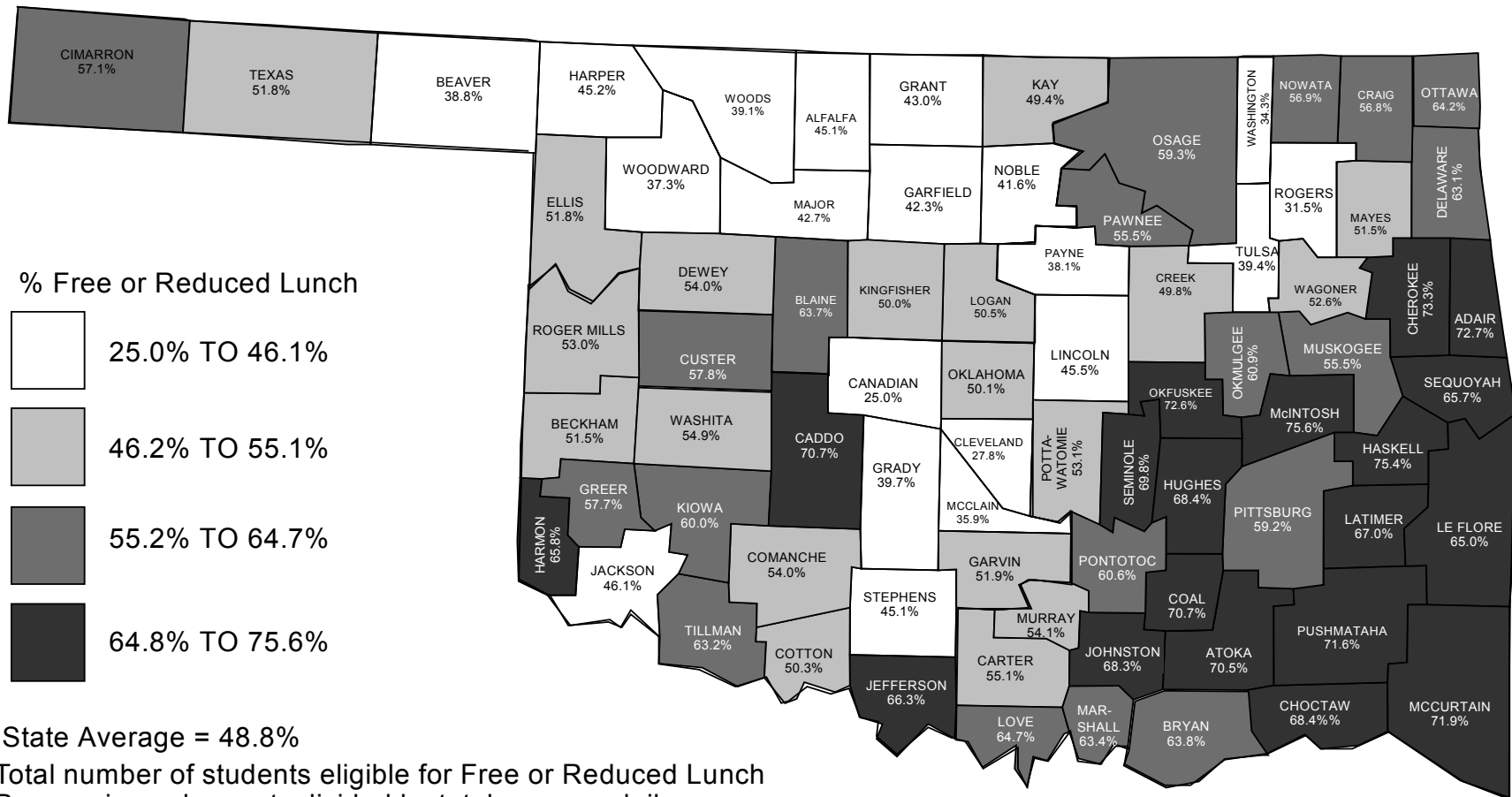

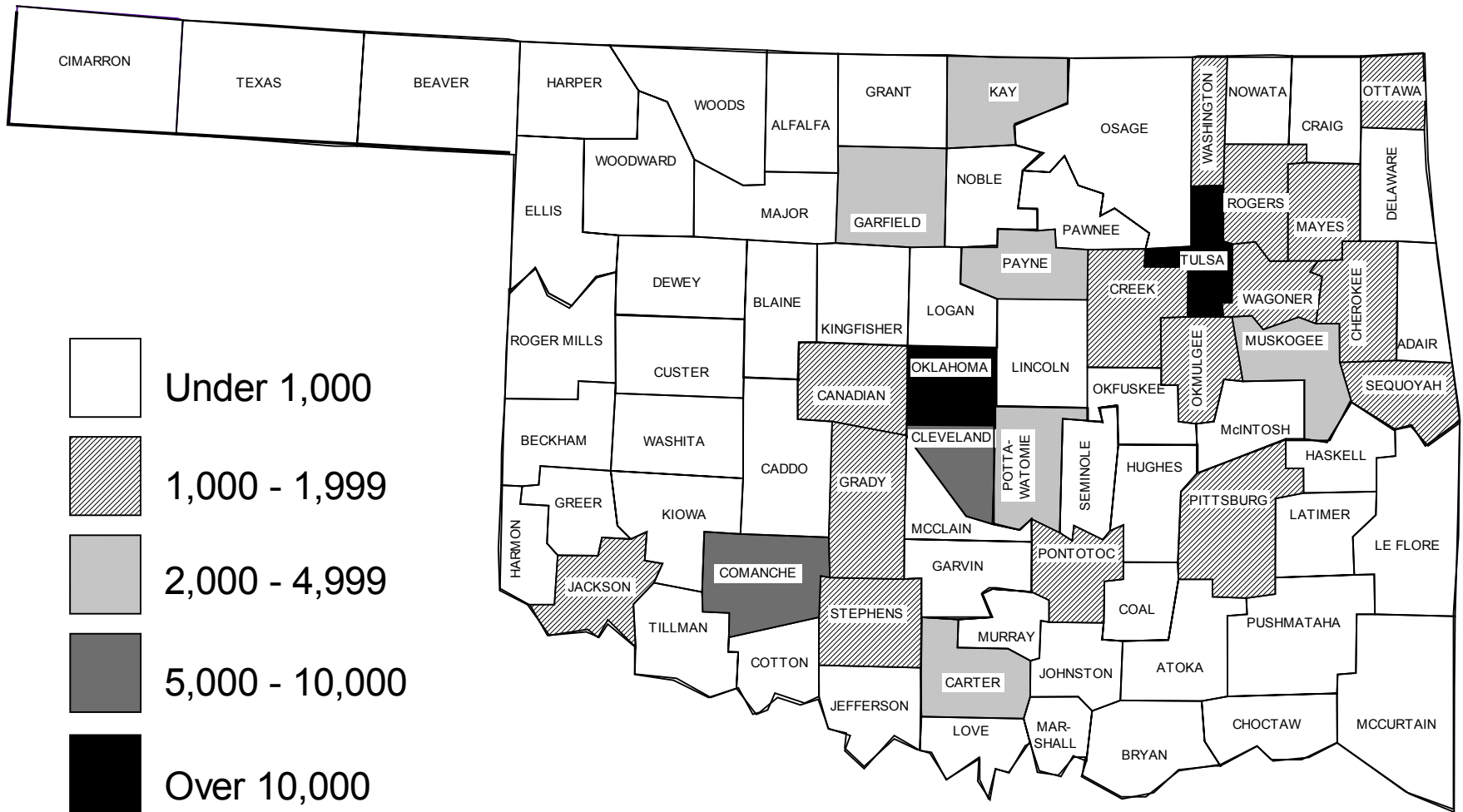
